November 4<sup>th</sup> - Students at Erie 1 BOCES' Maryvale Academy showed their respect for military service as they completed cards to be sent to area military veterans.

This year is the third year that students have completed the service project prior to Veterans Day, and the project has grown from recognizing 12 veterans to approximately 40 veterans to this year's count of 113 veterans. Veterans were identified for the outreach effort by the school's staff as well as community members.

Students at the academy also had an opportunity to hear from Charles Fieramusca, a relative of academy teacher Melissa Diguiseppe who served in the Army for three years, primarily as a tank gunner in Germany in the 1960s. Fieramusca said he thought veterans receiving the letters from the students would have a feeling of pride in their service.



#### Lasagna Garden

To understand the significance of decomposers in an ecosystem, students created their very own composter. A recycled tank was filled with several layers of commonly discarded items from around the school including mineral rich sand, food scraps, used paper, and autumn leaves, to understand how microscopic organisms facilitate the process of breaking down scrap material into useful nutrient rich soil. Students are responsible for the addition of new materials, record keeping, and maintenance of the composter. In the spring students will utilize the nourishing soil that was created to plant flowers for our pollinators and witness the benefits of their hard work.





## FRESHMAN SEMINAR

Preshman students at Maryvale Academy participate in a Freshman Seminar two days a week.
